## Course Content



## Day 1 :

Students will attend a long introduction to applying for US arts majors.
It comprises of the below two parts:

## Part 1: Overview of US Arts Majors and Programs

Gary will give a high-level overview of the top schools and programs across each area of arts, giving students a comprehensive understanding of the current landscape in terms of arts education in the US.

## Part 2: Preparing the Application Process

Gary will dive a little deeper into the logistics for applying to US art programs and the necessary preparation work that is required to complete the application. He will walk through 3 sample programs, which are the Ivy League sample, the popular non-Ivy League sample, and the art school sample.

## Day 2 \& Day 3:

Students will attend art lectures and workshops for 2 days. These lectures aim to familiarize the students with different mediums and an informative foundation on Art History. Upon completion of the lectures, students will be able to explain and write about their work through an artist's lens. The workshop at the end aims to engage them to create art pieces as steps to developing their final art portfolios.
